Living Illustration Teaches at Morning Star



↑ s our Church Ministries & Mission Development Director, one of my responsibilities is to conduct mission development training for churches and church boards throughout our South Central Conference territory. This frequently consists of sharing a seminar on a Friday evening, preaching a sermon on Sabbath morning, providing another seminar on Sabbath afternoon, and concluding with a board workshop on Sunday morning. As insightful and informative as the presentations may be, rarely is there a teaching tool better than a living illustration like the one we experienced at the Morning Star Adventist Church in Vicksburg MS.

On May 20–22, 2022, the Morning Star Church, under the leadership of Pastor Reginald Robinson, hosted a Spirit-led, Mission-driven Training Weekend. In the middle of the final session with the church board on Sunday morning, a young lady



named India, who had visited the church for the first time a few weeks ago at the church's community block party, entered the sanctuary with her two small children and sat on the back row. After going over to speak with India, the church's first lady, Cynthia Robinson, raised her hand to interrupt the training session. With India in hand she said, "Church, we need to pray now." Realizing that the very purpose of the training was to lead the church to seek the guidance and power of the Holy Spirit in simplifying their ministries and organizational structure to better focus on the mission of reaching the people in their community with the good news of salvation, it became obvious to all that THIS was what the Spirit



had on His board meeting agenda for this morning! As the board members gathered around India, she proceeded to share through her tears a story of brokenness, despair, and pain. Two board members held the children while another board member hugged and held India. Words of encouragement and hope were shared as more tears were shed, and the Spirit of God powerfully moved as prayers for deliverance, healing and wholeness were prayed!

The meeting ended (what else was there to say?!?) and members continued ministering to India over breakfast. And India came to worship at Morning Star this past Sabbath! This is what it looks like for a church to be Spirit-led and Mission-driven!


